Retrospective Cohort Study of Professional Titling Used in Grand Rounds Introductions

57 Ob/Gyn Grand Rounds Introduction Videos Analyzed



Consistent use of the presenter's professional title by the introducer as "Dr. Last Name or Dr. First Name/Last Name"



Gender Bias: not observed

-No significant difference in utilization of "Doctor" during introduction



Academic Rank Bias

- "Doctor" more likely to be consistently used if presenter was faculty vs trainee
- 55% vs 17%, $p=0.027$

A Rose by Any Other Name May Not Be As Sweet: Use of Descriptors in Ob/Gyn Grand Rounds Introductions

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Retrospective Cohort Study of the Use of Descriptors During Ob/Gyn Grand Rounds Introduction

62 Ob/Gyn Grand Rounds introductions reviewed



Professional and Personal descriptors used by introducers were identified

Majority of introducers ($n=62$, 86%) and presenters were women ($n=42$, 68%)



Introducers more likely to use descriptor with male presenters than female (60% vs. 33%, $p=0.047$)

When men presenters are introduced with a greater emphasis on likeability and accomplishments than women presenters, descriptor differences may contribute to a perception of gender bias
